I am always bringing up books that I read. I thought it might be fun to share with you the top five books I believe every Christian should read. I assume that you are reading your Bible every day. That, of course, takes priority over all other reading!

1) <u>Luther's Large Catechism</u> -This is written for all Christians, and especially for heads of household. I believe it is some of Luther's best writing. In fact, this is one of those books that should really be read every year. The entire Book of Concord is wonderful reading, but the Small and Large Catechisms are written specifically for laymen.

- 2) Johann Gerhard Meditations on Divine Mercy, translated by Rev. Matthew Harrison. Christians pray. Great prayers from those who have gone before us teach us how to pray better. - 3) <u>Grace Upon Grace: Spirituality for Today</u>, by Dr. John Kleinig. Have you ever heard, "I'm spiritual but not religious?" This book details what Christian spirituality actually looks like. - 4) Everyone's Luther: Concerning Christian Liberty This is a wonderful treatise by Dr. Martin Luther. It describes what the Christian life looks like day in and day out. (http://www.lulu.com/shop/bryan-wolfmueller/everyones-luther-concerning-christian-liberty/paperback/product-23244288.html)
- **5)** Has American Christianity Failed? by Rev. Bryan Wolfmueller. We are surrounded by false doctrine. It has crept into our church, the LCMS. Pastor Wolfmueller expertly shows how the false doctrines of revivalism, pietism, mysticism, and enthusiasm have crept into our church from the greater American church. We will be looking

### **EVANGELISM**

"Love thy neighbor"

1 John, chapter 4 is a great chapter to read to prepare for Easter, besides reading John 3:16-17 about God's great love and sacrifice for us. John teaches us how we can know and see God through love, and He will help us to love others. John shares in 1 John 4:7-8, "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. He who does not love does not know God, for God is love." And later in 1 John 4:19, "We love Him because He first loved us." Then he finishes with verse 21 "And this commandment we have from Him: that he who loves God must love his brother also".

It's an interesting observation that after you buy a new car, you suddenly often notice that same model of car being driven on the road. I've experienced something similar with my theme this year of "Love Thy Neighbor". I see this theme repeated in my daily devotions, Portals of Prayer, Pastor's sermons, tv shows and movies, newspaper and magazine articles. In the February 14th, Portals of Prayer, the verse from Ephesians 5:2, "Walk in love as Christ loved us." "Faith alone saves, but faith is never alone. Love is the fruit of faith. Just as a healthy tree bears good fruit, so do the Lord's Christians—those who believe in Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit—always abound in works of love toward their neighbors." In the February 24th, Portals of Prayer, the verse from Luke 6:27, "Love your enemies." "Jesus loved His enemies to the end. When His enemies nailed Him to the

cross, He prayed for their forgiveness." "When the Lord Jesus was met with hatred, He met His enemies with love." "When we consider how God met our hostility with mercy, our evil with good, the Holy Spirit works a change in our minds and hearts. He renews us in Christ 's image so that we begin to love our enemies, even as Christ loved us." Just recently in Sunday's March 17th Portals of Prayer, from Matthew 5:44, "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." "We can learn from Christ and Christians throughout history who have prayed for and embraced their enemies and persecutors, many of whom ended up becoming believers." "When we are reluctant to forgive, the Holy Spirit reminds us that God doesn't excuse sin. Rather, He put us sinners to death in Baptism and raised us up as a whole new creation to be His sons and daughters—and He can do the same for our enemies." You never know—one of your enemies may turn out to be one of the greatest believers and disciples of Jesus Christ. Just look at the conversion of Saul to the Apostle Paul.

There was also a very touching article in the February issue of the Lutheran Witness magazine entitled, "Who is My Neighbor?" about a lonely elderly parishioner living in a nursing home who shared a room with another lonely woman. "Despite spending about 22 hours a day only four feet away from each other, these two supremely lonely women did not even know each other's names." After a Pastor's visit, they discovered they both had grown up Lutheran and probably had attended the same Walther League events as teenagers. They eventually became friends, sisters, and even communed together. "No longer alone, these two were gathered together in Christ's name and He was there with them, according to His promise (Matthew 18:20). "In their final days, each found a special comfort in the fellow saint in the nearby bed" and neither complained about being alone again.

So, fellow believers, **love on everyone** in Jesus' name especially your neighbors and your enemies. Reach out to all those who you come in contact with on a daily basis. The Holy Spirit and God's Word may lead you to a dear and special friendship with someone you least expected. You don't want to miss out on any of the blessings that our dear Lord can give when you are open to being brought into the Lord's family and saved by His wonderful grace. (Ephesians 2:8,9)
