A MESSAGE from Pastor Maggard

Dear Saints of Grace,

I have written to you before about why I was not going to get the COVID vaccination. I think I have very good reasons for not getting the virus. I will not rehash them, but I still think they are good reasons. You may disagree and that is okay! One of the most frustrating aspects of the public discussion on COVID vaccinations is the total absence of any consideration about natural immunity. A study in Israel shows that natural immunity is stronger than the COVID vaccination. It also shows that natural immunity and the COVID vaccination together provide even stronger immunity. But the fact that natural immunity has been removed from any public discourse is a huge problem. As most of you know, Erin and I had COVID and, thanks be to God, the symptoms were not too severe.

I have decided to receive the COVID vaccination. I have already had my first shot and I will get the second one in a few weeks. This has actually nothing to do with the mandates that are coming out. I believe that the government is overextending its authority and I believe the courts will sort this out. But naturally, that will take some time. That is a separate issue. The reason that I am getting the vaccine is so that I can act as your pastor. This is what Paul is talking about when he says he is all things to all people:

19 For though I am free from all, I have made myself a servant to all, that I might win more of

them. 20 To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though not being myself under the law) that I might win those under the law. 21 To those outside the law I became as one outside the law (not being outside the law of God but under the law of Christ) that I might win those outside the law. 22 To the weak I became weak, that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all people, that by all means I might save some. 23 I do it all for the sake of the gospel, that I may share with them in its blessings. (1 Corinthians 9:19-23)

In other words, we put aside our preferences and desires so that we might be of service to someone else. In this case, I am putting aside my reasonable ethical objections to the vaccine so that I might be able to serve people in hospitals and nursing homes. These verses do not excuse sinful behavior nor allow for anyone to be in the office of the pastor, as it is sometimes misused. They talk about counting others as more significant than yourself and serving them in love.

Let us also remember that this is not a black and white issue. Please be kind to those who insist on vaccine mandates. And please be kind to those who are adamant on not getting the vaccine. As Peter says, "love covers a multitude of sins." (1 Peter 4:8) If we cannot show each other humility and kindness in the household of God, how can we

be light and salt to the world? Be firm in your own mind about what you think you should do and make allowance for your brothers and sisters in Christ. (Romans 14:1-9) May God richly bless you during these difficult times.

I love the way the Apostle Paul addresses his fellow Christians in his letters to the different churches in the New Testament. It's a lovely way to start a letter. I think I will start using this more often.

In our recent devotions we read the well-known passage, Matthew 4:18-22, of Jesus calling Simon Peter, Andrew, James, and John to be His disciples. All Jesus had to say to them was, "Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men" and they *immediately* left their nets and followed Him. There is such power in Jesus' words.

- The power to create "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made." John 1: 1-3
- The power to convict "For the word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart."
 Hebrews 4:12
- The power to forgive "Then He said to her, 'Your sins are forgiven." Luke 7:48
 ...He said to the paralytic, 'Son, your sins are forgiven you." Mark 2:5
- The power to heal "I say to you arise, take up your bed, and go to your house."
 Mark 2:11 "Then Jesus answered and said to her, 'O woman, great is your faith! Let it be to you as you desire.' And her daughter was healed from that very hour."

 Matthew 15:28

- The power to revive/resurrect "Then He came and touched the open coffin, and those who carried him stood still. And He said, 'Young man, I say to you, arise.' So, he who was dead sat up and began to speak." Luke 7:14

Why Was Music So Important to Martin Luther?

Since this month we are celebrating the Reformation, here is some historical info



In 1526 at the age of 33, Luther began to rearrange the typical church service. Luther believed the congregation should take a more active role in the service and he wanted this activity to be more singing.

Luther said, "We need to remove hymn singing from the domain of monks and priests and set the laity to singing. By the singing of hymns the laity can publicly express their love to the Almighty God."

In fact, Luther even had his own congregation practice their songs during the week before the services on Sunday!

This led Luther to begin writing hymns for his congregation to sing. He wrote a total of 36 hymns. Not many of them are sung today, but you have probably heard of "All Praise to Thee, Eternal God" or "Our Father, Who From Heaven Above" or "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God"; those are the most well-known of Luther's music compositions.

On this day, October 31st, Reformation Day, thank God for men like Martin Luther. Who knows if the church ever would have started singing together in their worship services? I, for one, am delighted that we do.


